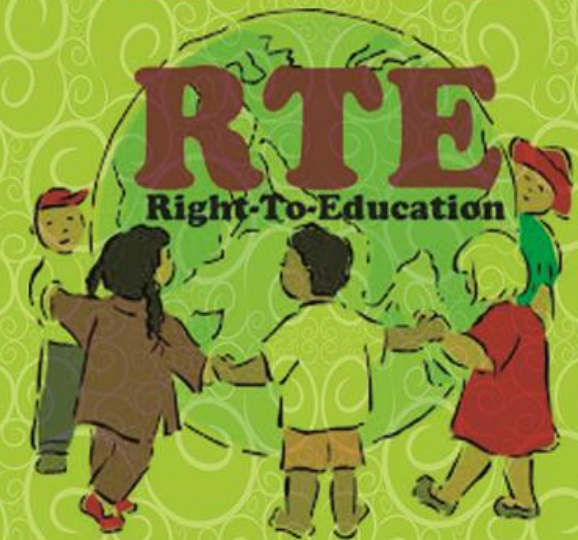

#### 2. Council For Teacher Education (C.T.E.)

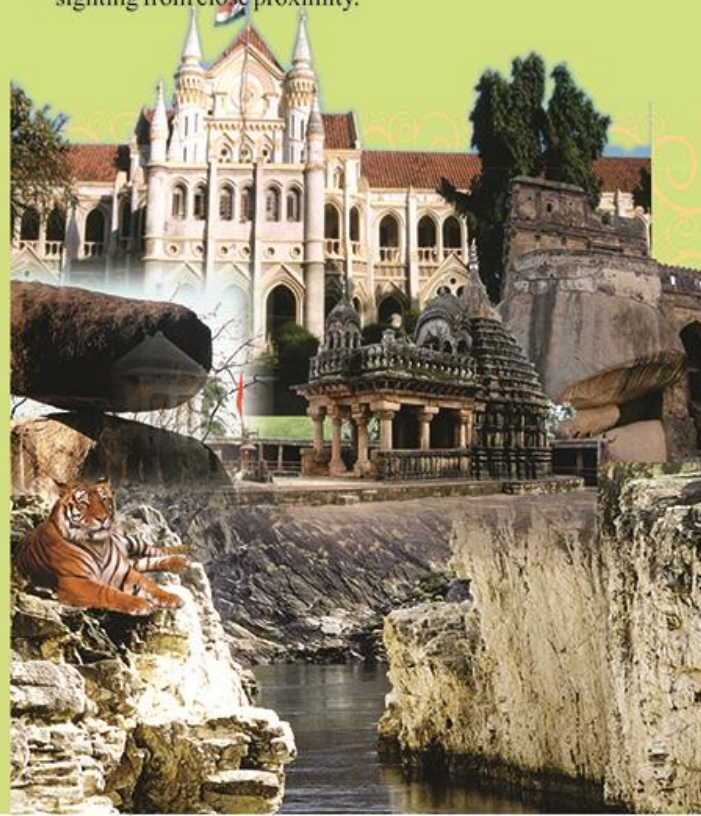
